Transformative and Mutually Reinforcing Effect of a Whole School Approach to Food

- Engaging collaboratively across sectors and interests – broad stakeholders from school communities and the food system (teachers, administrators, students, parents, civil society, food producers, health, university, etc.)
- Utilizing a diversity of levers (policy, programs, etc.) at multiple levels – school, district, province, national
